

Aston's Story



In December 2024, shortly before his 16th birthday, Aston Bevington from Porthcawl, Bridgend was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia, a rare type of cancer that affects the blood and bone marrow.

A promising young sportsman who is passionate about football and rugby, Aston was initially diagnosed with glandular fever, but his condition continued to deteriorate. He began to feel exhausted, nauseous and swelling spread to other parts of his body.

Further testing revealed Aston has a rare sub-type of Leukaemia. Due to the severity of the illness, it is likely he will need a stem cell transplant (also known as a bone marrow transplant) in order to fully recover.

To aid his recovery during his chemotherapy treatment, Aston has received blood and platelet transfusions.

Aston was due to finish his GCSE's this year and was hopeful of realising his dream of becoming a professional sportsman. We want to do everything we can to make sure Aston realises this this dream. But we need your help!

Aston's family is calling on people to join the Welsh Blood Service's stem cell registry in the hope they may find a match for Aston and to help as many other people as possible who are battling with blood cancer.

Key Facts





3 in 10 patients will not find a suitable stem cell donor 'match'.



For patients from a black, Asian, mixed heritage or minority ethnic background this increases to 7 in 10 patients who won't find a suitable stem cell donor 'match'.



Acute lymphoblastic leukaemia (ALL) is a type of blood cancer. It starts from white blood cells called lymphocytes in the bone marrow. The bone marrow is the soft inner part of the bones, where new blood cells are made.



White blood cells are a part of your immune system, they protect your body from infection. The white blood cells circulate through your bloodstream and tissues to respond to injury or illness by attacking any unknown organisms that enter your body.




There are roughly 250,000 people living with blood cancer in the UK. One in every 16 men and one in every 22 women will develop it at some point in their lives. It is the most common type of childhood cancer. Every year, more than 500 children aged under 15 are diagnosed with blood cancer.




Every year in the UK, 2000 patients will require a stem cell transplant.



A promising young sportsman, who plays football for Pontardawe Town AFC and rugby for Porthcawl RFC, Aston fell ill shortly before his 16th birthday in December 2024. Initially diagnosed with glandular fever, his symptoms worsened and was soon told he has Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia.

Due to the severity of the illness, it is likely he will need a stem cell transplant (also known as a bone marrow transplant) in order to fully recover.

There are 40 million registered volunteers around the world, but many patients still cannot find a match.

To help improve the odds of patients finding a suitable match the Welsh Blood Service are campaigning to recruit 4,000 new volunteers to join their stem cell registry this year.

We are calling on the [ORGANISATION NAME] community to join #AstonsArmy, to join the Welsh Blood Service's stem cell registry if you are eligible, and to help spread this vital message.






